Direction/Information

The Community Resources Department is seeking direction from the BoCC on future administration of the CSU Extension Fund 91 account balance.

Request and Recommendation

The CSU-Extension Division has a balance in account 13357 in the Treasurer's fund 91. This account funds the programmatic aspects of Extension's work in the community. It is used primarily to purchase materials used in supporting and delivering its programs, from 4-H rocketry kits and STEM materials, to Master Gardener training materials, to food preservation training materials and home energy audit kits, just to name a few.

We recommend moving the CSU-Extension balance in Fund 91 into a unique CSU-Extension cost center and tracking all revenues and expenditures as we do for our other cost centers (General Fund 10 and Fair Fund 34). This will provide the appropriate financial oversight and internal controls needed for the proper administration and management of the Fund 91 CSU-Extension funds.

Background

The CSU-Extension Division collects client fees to cover the materials and services aspects of its programs. Examples can include fees charged to citizens for lawn and tree checks provided by the horticulture team, identification of weeds and insects, class fees to attend cottage food certification workshops provided by the family and consumer science team and so on. These fees are deposited in fund 91 into account 13357 and have been for 14+ years. Expenses are charged to this account to pay for programmatic enrichment purposes to include the purchase of unbudgeted equipment, supplies, travel, etc. The credit and the debit entries are tracked in more detail in an Excel spreadsheet by a Business Associate and the balance is reported annually to the CSU Finance department in Ft. Collins.

CSU Extension's Fund 91 has been administered by the Treasurer's office in fund 91 for 14 +years. Prior to that, this account had its own bank account and was managed using a checkbook and monthly statements. The Arapahoe County CSU-Extension office is not different from other Extension offices in Colorado in how the funds are currently being managed.

It is our opinion that using fund 91 to account for the fees deposited and program expenditures is not efficient and certainly not an appropriate mechanism to record the level of transactions that occur on a monthly basis. One account, 13357, is used to account for all revenues received as well as all expenditures, which provides no general ledger differentiation. There is no workflow via FV60 and MIR7 accounts payable transactions, which means that there is no workflow available in SAP to provide the proper financial oversight of these funds. Prior to December 2014, a "Payment Authorization" form was completed by a Business Associate in the CSU-Extension office and the form was approved by a CSU-Extension Director or delegated signer. The form was then given to the Treasurer's office. The Treasurer's office staff would process a check. There was no workflow, review or approval by the Administrative Services Division, which is not consistent with how every other accounts payable check is processed in our department via FV60 and MIR7 accounts payable transactions. There are several examples attached to this BSR of CSU-Extension "Payment Authorizations" that have been used through November 2014. In December 2014, the Administrative Services Division implemented a change in the accounts payable process in order to provide an increased level of financial oversight and internal controls. This change included having all fund 91 CSU-Extension payables initially paid out of the CSU-Extension general fund cost center 103020000, then parking journal entries to move the expenditures to fund 91. This is not an efficient way to handle the accounting of the expenditures, but has been a substitute until a permanent solution could be implemented. Darcy Kennedy and Tim Aston met with Lynn Obremski, Erik Burge and Tanya Lepler from the Finance Department on 2/12/15 in order to discuss the background of the CSU-Extension fund 91 balance and ask for assistance in an appropriate solution. Unfortunately, with staff turnover in the Finance Department progress on a permanent solution has been delayed.

The current balance is over \$65,000 and the total revenue and expenditure figures and year end balances are listed in the following table.

Links to Align Arapahoe

Moving the CSU-Extension Division's balance from Fund 91 to a unique CSU-Extension cost center, using proper accounting procedures already established by the Administrative Services Division, will demonstrate *Fiscal Responsibility* as the funds will have proper financial oversight, internal controls and will be in alignment with Department guidelines and Arapahoe County fiscal policies and procedures.

Discussion

Because Fund 91 has a year-end balance annually, as shown above, it resembles a grant-funded account and because the funds have been tracked using Microsoft Excel, it lacks the accounting structure and best practices associated with using a non-fund 91 fund cost center in SAP. We believe using a unique cost center in either fund 10 or fund 26 to properly account for the revenues and program expenditures will provide superior accounting controls and financial oversight, more efficient data entry and enhanced reporting functionality. We therefore request the BoCC to approve moving the balance of the CSU-

Extension fees from fund 91 to either fund 10 or fund 26 using a unique cost center to be identified with the CSU-Extension Division.

Alternatives

Alternatives include:

- Continue to allow the Treasurer’s fund 91 account 13357 to hold the funds and continue to maintain Excel as a record-keeping vehicle. This is not in keeping with proper accounting practices and we do not recommend keeping the current status.
- Move the funds to CSU in Fort Collins so they could manage it for us. This may result in some loss of control and Arapahoe County would need to periodically audit the fund. We would prefer to continue to have 100% local control of the funds.

In that this is “county” money, i.e., fees collected from Arapahoe County Citizens that utilize the services of the CSU-Extension Division, our opinion is that the funds should be managed by properly using the county’s SAP financial system using either fund 10 or fund 26 with a unique cost center to properly account for the revenues and program expenditures. We do not recommend keeping the funds in fund 91 or moving the funds to Colorado State University. Reporting and auditing would be more efficient and functional in a unique cost center and internal controls would be more effective if the funds were accounted for in fund 10 or 26. SAP internal order numbers will be established as well to provide increased financial reporting flexibility.

Fiscal Impact

Fiscal impact to Arapahoe County Government is not anticipated. The Administrative Services Division and the CSU-Extension Division will work with the Finance Department to establish a unique cost center for these funds.

Concurrence

Follow-up on December 14 Direction: At the December 14 study session, the BOCC conveyed concern voiced by the director of the Humane Society of South Platte Valley (HSSPV) that HSSPV had not had an opportunity to submit a proposal for 2016 sheltering services. The Board directed staff to work with the Purchasing Division of the Finance Department to issue an informal bid request to HSSPV and to schedule a follow-up study session for the BOCC to review a comparison between the two sheltering options.

On December 28, Purchasing received a proposal and bid from HSSPV for 2016 sheltering services. A comparison of this bid with the terms of the proposed IGA is attached for the Board's consideration along with the operational and customer service considerations presented on December 14. The HSSPV proposal includes an explanation of the governmental allocation model and changes proposed from prior year agreements with the County.

Background – Update

Background for the staff's request and recommendation to approve an IGA with the City of Aurora for sheltering and related services provided through the Aurora Animal Shelter were included in the attached Board Summary Report prepared for the December 14 study session. Work on the IGA was completed in follow-up to a BOCC study session on November 2 at which time staff requested and received direction to pursue this option.

At the time of the December report, the Aurora Animal Shelter Manager, City Manager and City Attorney's Office had finalized a draft IGA in cooperation with the Arapahoe County Attorney's Office and County Animal Control Supervisor. The draft IGA had been reviewed and recommended in committee and was scheduled to go to the City Council for a December 21 study session to determine whether the full Council would support scheduling the IGA for action.

On December 14, the BOCC directed staff to solicit a bid from HSSPV for consideration along with the recommended IGA. The City Attorney elected to move the previously scheduled Council discussion to January to provide the BOCC additional time to receive the HSSPV proposal and decide whether to further pursue the option of an IGA. If the decision on January 11 is to pursue the IGA, the City Attorney will reschedule the IGA for Council consideration and action.

Current Contract Extended through January 31, 2016; New Agreement to Start February 1, 2016

As the decision on a sheltering contract for 2016 was delayed until January, the current sheltering agreement has been extended through January 31, 2016, at a cost of \$300 per animal sheltered with Humane Society of South Platte Valley (the same terms as the current HSSPV extension terminating December 31, 2015). Any new agreement approved with City of Aurora or HSSPV would begin February 1, 2016 and run through December 31, 2016. City of Aurora has indicated the \$30,000 for a 12-month agreement can be prorated for the remaining 11 months for a cost of \$27,500.

Comparison of Proposals

A comparison of the basic elements of the two proposals is attached to this Board Summary Report with respect to services provided and a base contract price. Other factors do not directly correlate, such as shelter location and cooperative arrangements between governmental programs. The HSSPV proposal also includes a governmental allocation model and changes from prior year agreements with the County.

Staff Recommendation – Updated from December 8, 2015

Staff recommends approval of the IGA with the City of Aurora, pending approval by the City Council and pending final review of any modifications to the IGA by the County Attorney's Office. This recommendation

is based on the operational and customer service opportunities outlined in the December 8, 2015 Board Summary Report.

Staff believes this is a unique opportunity to (1) improve operational efficiencies and build on the resources provided by two government agencies (much of Aurora is located within Arapahoe County), (2) improve record-keeping and accounting as both agencies use the Chameleon system, and (3) provide more centrally-located sheltering and medical care in closer proximity to eastern Arapahoe County than the current sheltering location, resulting in operational and customer service benefits. The Aurora shelter is located in Adams County, just south of I-70 and east of I-225 at Chambers Road (15750 East 32nd Ave, Aurora). HSSPV is located just west of Santa Fe Drive, north of Belleview (2129 W. Chenango Ave., Littleton).

City staff is supportive of this arrangement, has worked with the County Attorney's Office to draft an IGA, and is scheduled to take the proposal to the City Council for consideration if the Board of County Commissioners wishes to further pursue this option for 2016 sheltering and related services.

The Planning Division believes this may be a one-time opportunity to enter into an agreement with the City and see whether this is a good long-term working arrangement for both governmental entities. Although approval by the City Council is not a guaranteed outcome, the time invested to date by the City's shelter director, City attorney and committee review are positive indicators. It is unknown whether the City would be willing to reconsider this opportunity at a future time if the decision is to not move forward this year.

Alternatives for BOCC Action – Updated from December 8, 2015 Board Summary Report

Under Resolution 150211 of the Board of County Commissioners, the Public Works and Development Director was authorized to sign Intergovernmental Agreements and Memoranda of Understanding related to Public Works and Development projects and issues and to sign non-governmental agreements for services related to the work of the department. If the signature resolution for 2016 also includes this authorization, the Director may sign either agreement.

Alternatively, the BOCC may wish to place an agreement, either for the IGA or for a contract with HSSPV, on the consent agenda or general business agenda of a public meeting for Board approval.

1. Direct the Public Works and Development Director to sign the IGA with City of Aurora for the remainder of the 2016 calendar year, subject to approval of the IGA by the Aurora City Council and subject to final review by the County Attorney's Office prior to executing the agreement.
2. Direct the Public Works and Development Director to sign the Agreement for Services with the Humane Society of South Platte Valley. Staff further requests direction on whether to enter into a one-year agreement or a three-year agreement as proposed by HSSPV.
3. Direct staff to place an agenda item on the next available Business Agenda or Consent Agenda for approval of the IGA with City of Aurora for the remainder of the 2016 calendar year, subject to approval of the IGA by the Aurora City Council and subject to final review by the County Attorney's Office prior to executing the agreement:
 - a. Resolution authorizing the PWD Director to sign the IGA; or
 - b. Resolution authorizing the BOCC Chair to sign the IGA.
4. Direct staff to place an agenda item on the next available Business Agenda for approval of an agreement with the Humane Society of South Platte Valley for sheltering services for the remainder of the 2016 calendar year (specify one-year or three-year agreement):
 - a. Resolution authorizing the PWD Director to sign the agreement; or
 - b. Resolution authorizing the BOCC Chair to sign the agreement.

Subject: **Request for Direction to Approve an Inter-Governmental Agreement with the City of Aurora for Animal Control Sheltering and Related Services for the 2016 Calendar Year**

Request and Recommendation

Public Works and Development staff (Planning Division, Animal Control program) requests that the Board of County Commissioners provide direction on staff's recommendation to enter into an Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) with City of Aurora Animal Shelter for sheltering, veterinary and cremation services for 2016, subject to approval of the IGA by the Aurora City Council in January 2016, retroactive to January 1, 2016, and subject to final review by the County Attorney's Office prior to executing the agreement.

Under the signature resolution of the Board of County Commissioners for 2015, the Public Works and Development Director is authorized to sign IGA documents. As this IGA represents a significant change from current Animal Control operations and will replace a contract previously approved by the Board of County Commissioners for animal control sheltering services for 2015 and prior years, staff is requesting direction from the Board on this action.

Background

On November 2, 2015, at the request and recommendation of staff, the Board of County Commissioners provided direction to Public Works and Development/Animal Control to discuss and draft an IGA with the City of Aurora for sheltering, veterinary and cremation services for the 2016 business year for consideration by the Board of County Commissioners and the City Council.

This process was discussed between Public Works and Development staff and the Purchasing Division Manager of the Finance Department as a mechanism to replace the current sheltering arrangement and contract through a cooperative, intergovernmental arrangement that would improve efficiencies for both agencies and improve level of service for the County Animal Control operations as discussed in this report.

At the time of this report, the Aurora Animal Shelter Manager, City Manager and City Attorney's Office are working on an IGA in cooperation with the Arapahoe County Attorney's Office and County Animal Control Supervisor. The IGA will be going to the City Council for consideration in late December 2015 and early January 2016, effective retroactive to January 1, 2016, if approved.

Links to Align Arapahoe

Service First:

- The Aurora Animal Shelter is centrally located in Arapahoe County and will allow for easier access for eastern county residents (where a vast majority of animals are picked up);
- The shelter hours of operation are compatible with Arapahoe County Animal Control hours, and access will be provided for 24-hour drop-off by County Animal Control Officers;
- Aurora Animal Control and Arapahoe County would agree to assist each other, when needed, for large scale and emergency situations through staffing, equipment, and other operations.

Fiscal Responsibility:

- Location of the shelter is efficient for County operations, saving fuel and wear and tear on County vehicles used for animal control operations;
- Aurora Animal Shelter is offering a \$30,000 agreement for the 2016 calendar year, and per-animal cost overruns that currently impact our budget are not expected under the terms of the draft agreement;
- Aurora and Arapahoe County Animal Control Officers would work closely together on an as-needed basis on large-scale cases and emergency response;
- The IGA provides an opportunity for efficiencies for both agencies by combining resources.

Discussion – Terms and Benefits of Agreement

The current three-year sheltering contract with Humane Society of South Platte Valley expires December 31, 2015. The Animal Control Supervisor and Planning Division Manager have been in discussion with the City of Aurora Animal Shelter Manager since July 2015 regarding the possibility of entering into an intergovernmental agreement for sheltering, veterinary and cremation services. Since November 2015, the Aurora Animal Shelter Manager, City Manager and City Attorney’s Office have discussed the proposal and are drafting an IGA in cooperation with the County Attorney’s Office to present to the BOCC and City Council.

Under the terms of the proposed IGA, Aurora Animal Shelter will provide all services that HSSPV currently provides and additional reporting capabilities through Chameleon – the data management system used by Aurora and Arapahoe County Animal Control programs. While the \$30,000 annual cost for 2016 is based on an anticipated level of 150 animals per year, the agreement calls for review of cost of service only if the number of animals exceeds 220 and is not expected to result in a cost increase for the 2016 year based on actual numbers of impounded animals for the last four years. The shelter would retain all return-to-owner fees once pets are admitted to the shelter.

The proposed arrangement with City of Aurora provides opportunities for budget control and management in an area where costs throughout the year can be somewhat unpredictable, may improve the level of service to County citizens due to the more centralized location of the shelter and the veterinary care agreements the City has with Alameda Emergency Animal Hospital, and will house animals in a very well-run and professionally staffed shelter. County Animal Control Staff will have 24-hour-day access to the facility, and the Arapahoe County Sheriff’s Deputies can access night-drop boxes if needed based on Animal Control emergency response time.

Additionally, the County’s Animal Control staff will be able to pull reports directly from the Aurora Chameleon system (compatible with the County’s Chameleon system) and receive monthly reports from Aurora Animal Shelter staff. Staff of both agencies will cooperate to determine the appropriate per-animal cost of care throughout 2016 to determine whether a continued arrangement for a one-to-three-year

agreement starting in 2017 would be beneficial to both agencies and to help establish an appropriate annual cost. If a determination is made to not continue into future years with the City of Aurora, this data will be helpful in moving forward with an RFP or bid waiver by establishing a foundation for such cost of care.

Public Works and Development has worked with the Purchasing Division of the Finance Department to ensure that appropriate procedures have been followed in relation to procurement of services.

Alternate Service Arrangements to IGA

The alternative to entering into an IGA with Aurora Animal Shelter would be to renegotiate with Humane Society of South Platte Valley (HSSPV) and renew the current contract or a modified contract. The current three-year contract with HSSPV requires a payment of \$300 per animal once the established animal cap is exceeded; this has resulted in significant budget overruns in more than one budget year. These cost overruns were covered with funds from the Public Works and Development budget, but outside the Animal Control budget. As with the Aurora Animal Shelter proposal, HSSPV would also continue to collect all animal return-to-owner fees once the animal is in the shelter's possession.

Current and prior contracts with HSSPV were approved under a bid waiver as a comparable level of service was not available through other sources such that a Request for Proposals (RFP) could be issued. Prior to contracting with HSSPV, the County used an assemblage of private kenneling, veterinary and cremation services and contracts during the interim when the previous shelter was closed, also using a bid waiver process due to limited availability of services meeting County business needs. During this time, Public Works and Development also issued an RFP for out-sourcing animal control services to include sheltering and related services; only one bid was received, and that proposal was determined to not be cost-effective.

Fiscal Impact

The proposed IGA presents an opportunity to improve the efficiencies of operations and level of service through combined governmental resources. During the 2016 year, the manager of the Aurora Animal Shelter will meet with the Arapahoe County Animal Control Supervisor and discuss the actual costs associated with animals brought into the shelter. Determining an average per-animal cost will allow both agencies to budget more accurately for the 2017 year. If a determination is made to not continue into future years with the City of Aurora, this data will be helpful in moving forward with an RFP or bid waiver by establishing a foundation for such cost of care.

Alternatives for BOCC Action

1. Provide direction to the Public Works and Development Director to sign the IGA, subject to approval of the IGA by the Aurora City Council and subject to final review by the County Attorney's Office prior to executing the agreement.
2. Provide direction to not approve the IGA; in this case, Public Works and Development staff will work with the Purchasing Division of the Finance Department on an appropriate procedure to procure alternate sheltering and related services for the 2016 contract year.
3. Provide direction to staff to schedule an additional study session with the Board in January 2016 to further consider information presented; in this case, Public Works and Development staff will need to determine whether the current sheltering agreement with HSSPV could be extended on a month-to-month basis in the interim.

Hi Jan,

I have a call in to our attorney as well but wanted to make sure I got back to you with answers on a few of these questions. If a patron comes in to our shelter, regardless of what jurisdiction they come from we will take the animal in. We are an open admissions shelter and we would not turn anyone away. If a citizen brings us an animal from unincorporated Arapahoe we would not count that as an ACO impound. We would enter this into our system as a STRAY or OWNER SURRENDER depending on the situation. If one of your officers brings an animal in to our shelter that is an impound by an ACO and would count.

We do accept all breeds of animals including restricted breeds such as American Pit Bulls, American Staffordshire terriers and Staffordshire terrier. Our officers bring these in regularly. Once a dog becomes our property after the hold, we would look to see if a Breed Evaluation is needed. If so, we have teams of three certified Aurora Breed Evaluators to do a full breed evaluation. If the dog is determined to be restricted based on the main characteristics we would have two options for the dog. The first option is based on history, SAFER assessment and observed behavior in the shelter to call a transfer partner to take. Our transfer partners are all PACFA licensed and in good standing are generally members of MDAWA. We use Larimer Humane Society, Humane Society of Boulder Valley, Cheyenne Animal Shelter, Foothills, DFL and HSSPV along with Eagle County and Adams County. If the restricted breed after the holding period is determined to be aggressive, dangerous and not a safe transfer candidate we will humanely euthanize. If an owner comes in to claim the dog and we recommend a breed evaluation based on the residency in Aurora we would do so along with offering DNA to them at a cost. If they are reclaiming a restricted breed but reside outside of the city of Aurora we will send it home. If any animal is determined to have medical conditions that are not manageable or treatable and are suffering regardless of breed we will euthanize. I can pull our pit bull stats for you for your meeting.

There is a big misconception on what we have done here in the past with restricted breeds so I can only speak to the last 18 months since I have taken this role on.

I also wanted to include we have Live Release Rate of 88.2% Year to Date which is an 11% increase since 2014 based on our collaborative efforts with our fellow partners in animal welfare.

Let me know what else you need.



The Humane Society of the South Platte Valley, Inc. is a full service animal shelter for the community. We provide exceptional care to all animals that visit our shelter, and since we opened in 2009, we have maintained an extremely high Live Release Rate ranging between 95-97%. Because of the exceptional care that we provide to our animal guests, we have built a very devoted supporter base that shares our passion for helping lost and abandoned animals and giving every animal that comes into our shelter the best chance to be either returned to their family or find a new loving home. We enjoy working with our governmental partners, their citizens and animals to improve animal welfare in our community.

Over the past 3 years, we have worked closely with the cities of Littleton and Englewood to develop a mutually beneficial relationship and governmental allocation model. The model encourages the cities and shelter to work closely together to educate the community about responsible pet ownership, identification tags, microchipping, and spaying and neutering. All of these steps help in reducing the number of stray animals that visit the shelter, and in turn, the costs to the governments. In addition, both cities help us promote pet adoption. This helps our organization grow, in that we are able to help other animals that are in need, animals that do not come in as strays from the governments we work with. The governmental allocation model that has been developed takes this into consideration when we are calculating the charges to the governments. As the number of animals we serve, that come in from sources other than governmental contracts increases, the costs to the governments decrease.

How the governmental allocation model works – we’ll briefly describe how we calculated the 2016 amount of \$28,558 for Arapahoe County:

We began by projecting our 2016 expense budget that totaled \$786K. Then we back out adoption related expenses \$292K (spay/neuter, behavior, foster, volunteer, development, etc.). This leaves us the core expenses that we need just to operate an organization that would only house stray animals, and for the 2016 projections this amount is \$495K.

The next step is to determine the number of animals coming in as strays from animal control and the public. For 2016, we used the actual number of stray animals coming in from 10/1/14-9/30/15. We then estimate how many animals will come in from other sources, not as strays. For the 2016 calculation, 778 animals came in as strays for the period listed above. We estimate that we will help 1300 animals outside of the government contracts during 2016. Using these numbers, we determine the amount of costs that should be allocated to governmental usage:

Based on this calculation and actual usage by Arapahoe County, for the period 10/1/14-9/30/15 of 120 animals, we can calculate the 2016 fee of \$28,558 (120*\$237.98).

As evidenced by this model, there is definitely an opportunity for the costs to the governments to decrease as HSSPV grows, creating a mutually beneficial relationship! In addition, you are supporting your County's local tax-paying business.

We would be interested in entering into this type of relationship, moving forward, if Arapahoe County is interested in entering into a 3 year commitment to use HSSPV for its animal sheltering services. The current contract terms would still apply, except for the rate/period. We would also be willing to apply the \$237.98 rate to overages for 2015 and for the entire 2016 calendar year (the total billed for 2016 would be \$28,558 period). Should Arapahoe County's actual usage, during 2016, exceed 120 animals and reach a level of say 220 animals, that would be factored into the calculation for 2017's fee (when we look at actual usage for the period 10/1/15-9/30/16). In early October of 2016, we will look at this usage, our projected budget and projected number of animals from sources other than strays and calculate the fee for the 2017 calendar year using the allocation model discussed above. Once we determine the fee for 2017, that's the fee for 2017, period (in other words no true-up billings). Please note the County's historical animal usage has averaged 129 animals/year. We also noted in Aurora's proposal to their City Council Committee that they used 150 animals, not 220.

We are cognizant that using the Aurora shelter may be more convenient for your animal control officers and your citizens in the eastern portion of the county; however, there are other financial and animal welfare considerations that we are hopeful that your Commissioners will discuss when making a final decision on an organization to use for animal sheltering services:

- HSSPV does not have a breed ban. We see a high percentage of Pit Bulls and Pit Bull mixes that come in from the County – for the period of 10/1/14 -9/30/15, 16% of the dogs that came in were Pit Bulls or Pit Bull mixes. We have very passionate and vocal Pit Bull advocates in our community.
- As you can see from our calculation above, we would be charging you our costs for sheltering the animals from Arapahoe County, no mark up. In the Aurora proposal, they present that their costs to house an additional 150 animals would be approximately \$10,000, however, their charge to the County would be \$30,000, a \$20,000 mark up.
- As discussed earlier, we have a very active and generous support group. They help us fund our exceptional medical programs for the animals. We have seen some pretty extreme and costly medical cases come in from Arapahoe County; recently we had a boxer come in that was suffering from tetanus. Prior to being off of stray hold, the vet bills were approximately \$1000. We were able to reach out to our supporters and raise the substantial funds needed to save this dog's life. This is one of the reasons we have such a high Live Release Rate. Our community is extremely supportive of the work we do and saving lives. We hope the Commissioners will explore Aurora's support base and their Live Release Rate (which we were unable to determine from their website).

We hope the Commissioners will take into consideration the benefits of being associated with an organization, like HSSPV, that has a substantial support base in and around Arapahoe County and an outstanding reputation for care and placement of animals.

Request and Recommendation

The BoCC is being requested to authorize the Chair to sign the 2016 contract extension with Source Office & Technology. This is the second extension of this contract.

Background

Arapahoe County issued a Request for Proposal, RFP-13-73 in August 2013 to select an office supply vendor for the County. The solicitation closed in September 2013 and was evaluated by employees from the following areas: Fleet Management, Open Spaces, Clerk & Recorder's Office Human Resources, Finance Department, and the Assessor's Office. We had four companies provide proposals for evaluation by the County on the following weighted criteria; Contract Pricing, Quality and Reliability of Services Offered, Prior Experience in Performing Services for other Entities the Same Size and Scope as Arapahoe County, Quality and Viability of Invoicing, Payment Options and Reports, and the Ability to Support the County's Office Supply Needs.
