Direction/Information: This is an informational update to the Board of County Commissioners regarding topics surrounding the Office of Emergency Management.

Request and Recommendation

Office of Emergency Management Update Topics:

Updates on the outcome measures around Recovery:

- Meetings are set with the directors
- Should BOCC be the economic recovery support function leader?
- Recovery Planning Committee Chair
- Consider naming a Recovery Disaster Manager

Arapahoe County Incident Management Team:

- A multijurisdictional team that has been historically funded by South Metro Fire Rescue
- Team members from SMFRA, ACSO, AFD, DFD, Centennial Airport, and private citizens as SMEs
- County should sponsor and fund minimally, up to \$5,000 per year
- Joint training between Arapahoe, Douglas and soon Elbert will take place in June and on-going

OEM Regionalization-duplicate functions:

- Space sharing-house similar functions in unified location
- Purpose designed space for OEM offices and EOC

Arapahoe County Volunteer Organizations Active in a Disaster (VOAD):

- As an outgrowth of the Southview Towers fire, we'll begin the coordination of a group of affiliated volunteers that will become the Arapahoe County Volunteer Organizations Active in a Disaster
- The VOADs become a self-sustaining, self-governing group that can deal with many issues like the ones that don't belong to government after a disaster.
