The request is for the third and final extension of the agreement pursuant to the provisions as set forth in the above reference solicitation, RFP-13-57.

Background

Greg Romberg has an extensive background in government and government relations and has been retained as Arapahoe County's legislative lobbyist since January 2003. Greg's responsibilities include reviewing and analyzing all legislative bills, forwarding those of possible interest to the BoCC Administration Department for Commissioner and department distribution, communicating with Arapahoe County Legislators, being the County's advocate on positions as necessary, and providing regular updates on bill status to the Board of County Commissioners and the Manager of the BoCC Administration. Over the past few years, his participation has increased with extra meetings with legislators.

Background

The Colorado Department of Veterans Services requires assistance to veterans and their families in compliance with Sections 28-5-801 et seq., Colorado Revised Statutes, in receiving their benefits such as, but not limited to:

Burials:

- Provide veterans within Arapahoe County the information regarding their burial allowance
- Advise and assist family members of veterans collection of death pension

Health Services:

- Assist veterans in processing claims for medical benefits
- Assist and coordinate with veterans' Medicaid cases

Claims:

- Prepare, present and appeal claims for VA benefits on behalf of Arapahoe County veterans and their dependents

Links to Align Arapahoe

The services provided to veterans through our Veterans Services Office link to the Align Arapahoe Initiatives of Quality of Life and Service First. By connecting veterans to the resources available for them and assisting them with claims which may increase their available income, quality of life is improved. Service First is met through the timely and professional delivery of services to all veterans and family members who work with the Veterans Service Office.

Discussion

Arapahoe County Veterans Services provides full-time assistance to veterans and their families as required by state statutes.

Alternatives

This document is a state form required by the State of Colorado to be submitted monthly as application for monetary benefits payable to the County General Fund in accordance with Section 28-5-707 Colorado Revised Statutes.

Fiscal Impact

The County receives \$16,560 annually for the services provided to veterans in Arapahoe County. There is also a positive fiscal impact to individual veterans through successful claims recoveries.



Direction/Information

During the August 29, 2016 Drop-in Session the Board of County Commissioners approved the Waiver from RFP to allow us to “select source” BenePlace as the County’s Discount Website Administrator and requested that the waiver be added as a Consent Agenda item for formal adoption at a Public Hearing.

Background and Information

As part of the 2017 Total Compensation program, the County will be offering employees’ discounts through a third party administrator. There are very few providers of this service. The fee for this service is waived for the County by allowing the administrator to take over the management of the current Liberty Mutual Home & Auto offering.

For due diligence we have reached out to three public organizations that we were told used this service:

- State of Colorado – did not do an RFP as there was no cost for the program. Informally they looked at three providers and selected Benefit Hub.
- City and County of Denver – do not use.
- Denver Public Schools – do not currently use.

Impact to Arapahoe:

There is no financial impact on the County.

The Chair declared the motion carried and so ordered.
