New design coming for Colorado driver's licenses and ID cards

Arapahoe County Driver's License offices to close for one day in April to allow State to roll out new card design

LITTLETON, CO – After more than a decade, Colorado driver's licenses, instruction permits and ID cards are getting a new look and improved security features.

Arapahoe County will begin to offer the newly designed cards in April at its two limited-service driver's license offices in Centennial and Littleton. In order to prepare for the new design, these offices will close for one day while the Colorado Department of Revenues rolls out new software and trains employees.

- Driver's License services at the Clerk and Recorder's Centennial Branch Office (6954 S. Lima Street) will be **closed April 5**.
- Driver's License services at the Clerk and Recorder's Littleton Branch Office (5334 S. Prince Street) will be **closed April 12**.

Closure notices will be posted on the County website and at each branch. All other Clerk and Recorder services will remain available at both branches, including motor vehicle titles and registration. In addition, nearby State driver's license offices in Aurora, Parker and Littleton will be open on these dates.

Colorado residents should continue to use their valid driver licenses, instruction permits and identification cards with the current design through their expiration date. There is no need to renew until the current card expires. Customers who order a new card will receive a temporary paper document with a removable section that resembles the card. The temporary document will be valid for 30 days while the physical card is produced and mailed. Fees for license, permits and ID cards will not change.

The new card design features pale blues and greens, with a silhouette at the center of Mount Sneffels, located between Ouray and Telluride. The card also includes laser engraving of the customer's information and the cardholder's photo in grayscale to enhance the security and safety of the document.
