*Working Group hosts several meetings to present the results of the High Line Canal Preservation and Enhancement Planning Study*

Funding for this project and other planned improvements to the High Line Canal Trail is made possible by the generous citizens of Arapahoe County through the voter-approved Arapahoe County Open Space Sales and Use Tax, which is dedicated to preserve open space, enhance parks, build trail connections and protect our heritage areas.

During the November 2011 election, residents voted (with more than 62 percent approval) to continue the Arapahoe County Open Space program that extends the quarter of a penny sales and use tax for an additional 10 years to Dec. 31, 2023.

Since the program's inception, the County's Open Space program has conserved more than 18,000 acres of open space, built more than 30 miles of new trails and created and enhanced neighborhood and regional parks.
