Arapahoe County begins construction on Quincy Bridge

Aurora, CO – From now through January 2011, Arapahoe County will be conducting maintenance on the Quincy Bridge over Coal Creek, as part of its annual bridge rehabilitation program. The bridge is located two miles east of the Arapahoe County Fairgrounds and Regional Park in Aurora.

The bridge, now more than 50 years old, carries more than 2,200 cars a day. The regular maintenance includes refurbishing of the bearing devices and heavy concrete patching on the piers. These improvements will help the bridge maintain its functionality and keep it structurally sound.

Since all designated work will take place under the bridge, both east and westbound lanes will remain open for the duration of the project. Construction will take place 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday but should not have an impact on motorists.

“We are committed to providing a safe transportation infrastructure throughout Arapahoe County,” said Commissioner Rod Bockenfeld, who serves as Board Chairman. “Every year, we set aside a pool of money to maintain and repair our bridges that benefits Arapahoe County residents, as well as the commuting public.”
