Arapahoe County begins construction on Inverness Bridge

Centennial, CO – On Feb. 22, Arapahoe County will begin work widening the Inverness Drive East bridge, as part of its annual bridge rehabilitation program. The bridge is located just north of the East Inverness Place Cul-de-Sac.

By increasing the width of the bridge, drivers will experience safer driving conditions that include the ability to see farther ahead and gauge roadway conditions, greater clearance between lanes and enhanced safety for bicyclists and pedestrians.

In an effort to minimize traffic impact during construction, there will be two open lanes, one in each direction to facilitate traffic, bicyclist and pedestrian movements. Construction will impact traffic 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and some evening and weekend work may occur. Assuming good weather conditions, the work is expected finish by April 28.

The Inverness Golf Course will remain open at all times.

“We are committed to providing a safe transportation infrastructure throughout Arapahoe County,” said Commissioner Rod Bockenfeld, who serves as Board Chairman. “Every year, we set aside a pool of money to maintain and repair our bridges that benefits Arapahoe County residents, as well as the commuting public.”
